## **School Safety**

Our schools are filled with people who love our kids and are doing their best to watch out for them. And we have protocols in place to keep them safe, from site safety plans, police officers and security guards on campus, safety training, and open lines of communication. <u>Learn more about School Safety</u>

We can't do this alone. We all have a role to play in ensuring our schools remain safe places for learning. Please talk to your children about gun safety, social media threats, and other safety issues that may arise at their school. Remind them that they should tell an adult if they hear about the possibility of a gun at school or if they know about a student who has a weapon. We repeat it all the time, but saying something when you see something truly makes a difference. It has helped prevent potential problems in the past and will help in the future.

Remember: If you see something, say something!

Safety is important to our school and community, and we need your assistance. We will now implement a system where guests and families will be required to show identification at the front door camera before access is granted into the office. Please plan 15 minutes when picking up your student prior to the end of the school day. In addition, please make sure your information and emergency contacts are updated in ParentVUE, as we will not allow unauthorized access. For dismissal, we will not release students 15 minutes before the last bell (2:50 pm) as the end of the day is a very busy time for teachers and students.

Please use the east parking lot when dropping off or picking up your student before and after school. The west parking lot near the pool is ONLY for staff parking; **please do not** use this parking lot as it creates an unsafe situation for everyone.

## Information for 22-23 School Year Student Drop Off/Pick Up

It is not safe to drop off children more than fifteen (15) minutes before school or to leave them for more than fifteen (15) minutes after the school day ends.

- Gates/Doors at EMS will open at 8:00 AM.
- Students are not allowed on the EMS campus until 8:00 AM (unless approved by EMS Staff or Administration for limited special events)
- Parents must not leave their children on a school campus longer than fifteen (15) minutes either before or after the school day
- School grounds are not supervised outside the school day. Safety is our main focus.
- Parents/guardians are expected to follow the school's policy or procedure for drop off/pick up

#### **COVID-19 Updates**

The COVID-19 virus spreads easily, and symptoms can range from mild to severe, which is why Albuquerque Public Schools, under the guidance of the New Mexichealth and education departments, has outlined COVID safe practices for the 2022-2023 school year.

- Students who are sick should stay home. Please let their school know they will be absent.
- If students are sick or have a fever, it is recommended that they take a COVID test, even if they are vaccinated.
- APS schools will provide free at-home rapid test kits for students who exhibit symptoms or have been identified as close contacts.

## **EMS Student Dress Policy**

Recently the APS Board of Education created a procedural directive on student dress policy. At this time, all APS schools must review and gather feedback on their current policies. We are in the process of reviewing the EMS Student Dress Policy and will be gathering feedback from all of our constituents in the next few months. As we work on the policy, the <u>current EMS Student Dress Policy</u> shall be in effect. Please visit our website for our current expectations.

#### **Volunteer with APS**

While encouraging family and community participation, we must consider the safety of every child in the district. State law requires a background check from volunteers before participating in any volunteer activity at any APS school.

- APS background checks are valid for two years.
- After completing and submitting the Volunteer Clearance Request, the background check may take 7
  to 10 business days to process.
  - Clearance decisions may take longer if any instances appear in the background check.
- You must complete the Payment section in the Volunteer Clearance Request before you can submit your application and begin the background clearance process.
